Too-large fonts look like a children's book. Your eyes have to move more, and you have to turn more pages. This gets tiring. Compact-width fonts, e.g., Times Roman, look best in 11 or 12 points. Wider fonts, e.g., Palatino, look best in a smaller font size, usually 10 or 11 points. "Large print" books are at least 14 points.

Self-Publishing Basics: How to Pick the Size of your Book

The standard size for a mass market paperback is around 4.25\u0026 by 6.87\u0026. Books at this size usually come with a tiny typeface and spine flexibility ranging from minimal to moderate. KDP standard book sizes include most standard book dimensions, but they exclude the mass market paperback size.

Is it the right font size? Traditional printing uses 10-12pt font for large text blocks. The font size for headlines balances wanting large text with the convention of keeping headlines to one or two lines. Subheadings should be about 10 points larger than body text.

The secret, he explains, is to use the universal "epub" format to create a single e-book file that will be accepted by every digital retailer, from Amazon.com through Barnes & Noble, the Apple iBookstore, and smaller booksellers like the Canada-based Kobo. "Most beginners write their books in Word or Open Office," NotJohn says, "and then they up to upload the same document for conversion to an e-book. Sometimes it works; more often it doesn't, because these programs litter the file with hidden formatting. The result can be a disaster." Instead, the word-processing document should be converted to clean HTML, the markup language used to create a web page. (All e-books are web pages at heart, and the Kindle and other e-book readers are just special-purpose web browsers.) The conversion from document to HTML file takes seconds. It can then be plugged into a simple template that NotJohn includes in this Guide and also makes available on his blog for anyone to use. He also supplies a style sheet to format the book for best appearance on the Kindle, Fire tablet, the various Kindle apps, as well as on competing tablets and e-book readers.
