One of the first important critical works to explicitly tackle this question was Richard Dorson's 1957 *Journal of American Folklore* article "The Identification of Folklore in American Literature," part of the published proceedings of an MLA forum on the subject. Dorson typified the early approach to studying folklore and literature, which most often involved a type of "genre hunting" in which the critic searched out particular pieces of folklore in literary texts, like ghost stories, ballads ...

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
